## Asset Management – Energy Efficiency Grant

The contract has been signed with Revision Energy. There appears to have been some issue at NHDES that is slowing approval through G&C, but I've been told the project should be approved by end of May.

### Pine Hill Franchise Area

From last report: We have received the last bit of clarification on the Pine Hill Franchise Area from the developer. All utilities will be installed to Precinct specifications. Although there is uncertainty whether or not the Town will accept the roadways as Town owned/maintained, it is my recommendation that the Precinct accept ownership of the water main within the road ROWs (Eastman Road, Bonita's Way) just like we would for watermain within any Town road. This includes the service laterals up to the curb stop within the ROW. It is also my recommendation that we do the same for the sewer mains and the central sewer pump station.

#### Commission Meeting 05/10/2023

#### Adopted: 5/24/2023

The primary reason for accepting ownership of these utilities is so that the Precinct can maintain control over their use. There is still undeveloped land that will be served by these utilities, and it is important that the Precinct has some level of control over the who/what/where/how of future development and connections.

Needs a vote at some point to accept ownership contingent upon work being completed to Precinct Specifications.

#### Pickup Truck Purchase

Both trucks have been picked up and we're very happy with each so far. Plow installs will be scheduled soon.

#### Cell Tower

No change.

### Well 3 VFD

We've begun the process of installing the new VFD in the control building. Even though this is the more expensive option, it has a couple distinct advantages. The bunker in which Well 3 is located is technically a confined space requiring extensive safety protocols each time someone enters – the more we can remove from that bunker, the less need we have to enter the bunker. Secondly, even though the bunker hasn't flooded again in more than 12 years, the potential exists because it is recessed. Removing the VFD provides greater resilience to future flooding. Flood Damage

The Precinct's skid steer loader was left near the river at Well 6. The floodwaters rose too quickly for Precinct staff to move the equipment on Monday morning and the skid steer was submerged for an extended period of time. An insurance claim has been filed. We've had a local contractor use their crane to lift the machine onto the Precinct's trailer. We will take it to the dealer in Westbrook, ME where they will work to see if it's salvageable.

### Landfill Leachate RFQ

There has been interest from well-known firms with experience working with landfill leachate and PFAS.

### Water Operator & PT Admin Hiring

The candidate we had hoped to bring forward for the PT Admin has withdrawn her application. We've readvertised the position in the CDS and will also advertise on Indeed.

We have received zero applicants for the Water Operator. I have reached out to the MWV Career Tech Center to see if there are any soon-to-be graduates interested.
